Christmas Services/Gwasanaethau'r Nadolig

Plygain Merched y Wawr ar Nos Sul Rhagfyr 3ydd

Cynhaliwyd y Blygain eleni yng Nghapel y Tabernacl gyda chynrychiolwyr o gapeli, eglwysi a mudiadau'r dref yn cymryd rhan. Babell Zion Newydd was represented this year by our singing party- our Minister Emyr, Sian, Carole, Nelda, Rosemary, Helen together with a guest appearance by Linda Williams from Craig Cefn Parc whom we can always depend upon to keep Emyr on track. The carol chosen was 'Seiniau Gorfoledd o Fethlehem a glywir' written by the late Rev Maurice Loader with music composed by Caradog Williams. Tabernacle raised a choir for the occasion. Seingar mixed choir and Tonic, Ladies' choir also took part. Capel Priordy had a separate Ladies' Choir and a hearty male chorus. There was a quartet from Llangunnor, as also from the YFC with a flute and reading from Penuel and a solo from Elim. The collection this year was donated to Ty Hafan.

What is the meaning of Plygain?

The word Plygain comes from the Latin words 'pulli cantio' meaning the song of the cockerel and originally the Plygain service would have been held at cock's crow, early on Christmas morning between 3 and 6 am to herald the celebration of the birth of Christ. It later became a tradition to hold the service at night and today it is held in different venues throughout Wales and throughout the Advent with the last one being held at Llandeilo Fawr Church on the last Sunday of January.

The true Plygain begins with a reading, a prayer and congregational carol and then it is announced that the Plygain is open: "Mae'r Plygain yn awr yn agored." Groups come forward in turn to sing a special Plygain carol which records the life, death and resurrection of Jesus and which could in olden days be up to twenty verses long and theological in content. Today verses are much shorter. The words were sung to the popular tunes of the day which would have been the traditional Welsh folk tunes.

The chapel which hosts the service is the first to sing and then people come forward in no prearranged order. The second half of the evening begins after the singing of a congregational carol and then the groups come forward in exactly the same order as the first half ensuring that noone sings the same carol twice which means that you have to have one or two ready just in case. In years gone by it was whole families who used to sing at the Plygain services following weeks of rehearsing at the fireside

on those dark winter nights. At the end of the service all the men come forward to sing "Carol y Swper" which, as the title suggests, is followed by a hearty supper in the vestry or church hall.

It is thanks to the people of Montgomeryshire in the main for preserving this tradition over the centuries and it is in this county that the Plygain remains strong to this day. I'm sure we look forward to learning another carol in the tradition of the Plygain for next year. Let's not leave it too late.

Community Carol Service/ Gwasanaeth Garolau i'r Gymuned

On December 10th we hosted a Community Carol Service for the first time in very many years. Cymdeithas Sant Cynnwr back in the day used to arrange a Carol Service for the parish alternating between Llangunnor Church, Babell and Philadelphia with groups within the parish taking part and being represented in different ways. It was lovely to see so many present this year. Our Minister presided over the service and the following took part: Crescendo Choir, under the baton of Debbie Peake, sang two items; the readings were taken by Shirley Ingram [WI], Peter Evans [Eglwys Llangynnwr], Lynette Jones [Philadelphia], Pat Morgan and Helen Gibbon [BZN], Isobel Hughes [Cyngor Ysgol Llangynnwr], Councillor Elwyn Williams [Community Council] and Mr Aled Davies [Pennaeth Ysgol Llangynnwr headmaster]. The organist was Carole Rees.

Dydd Gweddi'r Byd/ World Day of Prayer

On the morning of November 29th Molly and Helen represented BZN in Heol Awst Chapel Vestry for the preparation of the World Day of Prayer to be held on the first Friday in March 2024. The service had been prepared by Christian Palestinian women six years ago and many wondered what may have happened to them during these last few months during the war in Gaza. The focus of the service is based on the passage from Ephesians 4:1-7 '....to bear with each other in love, despite all difficulties and oppression.' Little did they know at that time that their world would be turned upside down within six years and that the words of Jesus quoted by the Apostle Paul to the church in Ephesus would have fallen on deaf ears.

Christmas Eve Service

Our Minister led the candlelit Communion Service on Christmas Eve and it was good to see so many present. We were also joined by Rev Adelaide and members of her family. The Plygain party sang the carol they had prepared for Tabernacle and as it neared midnight the Minister led us to the Communion table after a purposeful message reiterating the question "Is there room in the Inn?"

A Poem by the late Rev J Eirian Davies
