Mike Shephard writes

GOOD GOLLY MISS MOLLY

Molly Thomas was one of the most courageous people I have met.

She and I were part of the same church walking group, and, at eighty years of age, she could give many a younger person lessons in endurance. We always walked at the pace of the slowest walker, but every walk had its challenges. Molly was up for them all and aided by her grandson, Ben, always acquitted herself well. In May 2022 she succeeded in reaching the top of Penyfan in the Brecon Beacons – no mean achievement. Her legs were 'like jelly' coming down but she refused to give in with determination and resolve being etched into her face.

Molly displayed similar courage when discussing the future of the Christian Church – which she so dearly loved. She argued for fundamental change and viewed our present denominations and divisions as nonsensical. The spectacle of believers walking into separate buildings to worship appalled her and her vision was of a united community bound together to love and serve others. Shortly before she died, she expressed regret that she would not live to see the dream become a reality and was critical of those who saw closure as preferable to unity. Molly demonstrated courage in standing up for her beliefs.

Molly was diagnosed with Pancreatic Cancer towards the end of 2023. It had spread to the Liver and when I last saw her – early in January 2024 – she knew that she had weeks to live. Seldom, if ever, have I witnessed such courage in the face of death and her words are ingrained in my memory:

When death comes it will be a release for me and will arrive not as an enemy but as a friend. I have made all the necessary arrangements. I have chosen the hymns as well as the music to be played. There will be a chapel service which will be conducted by Emyr, our minister. I also want you to take part and would ask that you pay a tribute. I want it to be a tribute with a difference in that I want you to introduce humour into the service and tell a joke to lighten an occasion which is likely to be sombre. Do you recall the joke told in one of your books? I couldn't stop laughing when I read it. It was so silly! It was so stupid! That is the one I want you to relate.

I explained to Molly that I had never ever told a joke at a funeral service. It was not the done thing. What if it caused offence? What would the family think about the introduction of hilarity at so serious a time? Molly repeated that it was what she wanted and asked her son to witness that such was the case. She continued thus:

I know that the mood will be somewhat sombre, but I do not want it to be like that. I have no fear of death and see it as the gateway into the next stage of life's adventure. I will miss my family and they, I know, will be devastated by my passing. I can understand those feelings but want them to be happy for me. I want them to smile as they say goodbye to me. Promise me that you will tell that ridiculous story. Here is the joke told at Molly's funeral:

Four men were walking down the road. Three of them were pushing prams as their wives had just given birth to babies – all boys. Their friend's wife had not yet given

birth, but the child was expected within weeks. He asked the others what names had been given to their children.

The first man said that his child had been born on St George's Day and had been called George. The second man explained that his son had arrived on St Andrew's Day and had been called Andrew. The third man's baby had arrived on March 1^{st} – St David's Day – so had been given the name of David.

Later that day the man discussed the matter with his wife. He expressed the hope that their child would also be born on a special day so that he or she could be named accordingly.

Some weeks later four prams were being pushed down the road and the new father was questioned about the name given to the most recent arrival. He exclaimed: "This is our daughter. Her name is 'Pancake.'"

I am happy to report that the congregation 'all' laughed – all 180 of them! I have no doubt that Molly was there in spirit and was laughing as well.

Molly's funeral service, incidentally, took place on Tuesday 13th February 2024. This just happened to be Shrove Tuesday – Pancake Day!

Keep smiling Molly. May God smile on you and continue to hold you in the hollow of his hand.


