Revd Dr Gwilym Davies was the originator of the the 'Neges Heddwch ac Ewyllys Da' [A message of Peace and Good will] which is sent out by Urdd Gobaith Cymru to the world on May 18th every year. It was first sent in May 1922 and within a decade 68 countries had responded to it. The aim was to translate it into 100 languages and to reach 100 countries by 2022. Dr Davies was a Baptist Minister and a strong peace

activist. He used radio, cinema and the press to promote peace in the world and was also the founder of the League of Nations which later became known as UNESCO.

This year, the peace message celebrates a centenary since the Women's petition for Peace was sent from Wales to America. On 19th of February 100 years ago an oak chest was opened containing a petition which appealed for co-operation for peace in the world. 390,260 Welsh women had signed the petition which was taken to the USA in an oak chest by Annie Hughes-Griffiths, Mary Ellis, Elined Prys and Gladys Thomas and presented to the women of the USA in the Biltmore Hotel, New York. The petition has now been returned to Wales from the Smithsonian National Museum of American History and has been donated to the National Library, Aberystwyth.

We look forward to hearing this year's message on May 18^{th} .

William Nantlais Williams yw'r awdur. Gweinidog Bethany Rhydaman o 1900 tan ei ymddeoliad yn 1944. Fe'i ganwyd yn Gwyddgrug, Pencader yn 1874 ac felly mae'n gan mlwyddiant a hanner ei eni eleni. Roedd yn fardd ac yn enillydd eisteddfodol ond pan gafodd droedigaeth yn 1904 fe roddodd y gorau i gystadlu er mwyn rhoi ei holl sylw i'w Arglwydd ac i'r weinidogaeth. Ym marn Dr Gwyn Davies v mae ei emvnau cynharaf vn emynau neis i blant ond yn ddiweddarach cawn emynau o sylwedd ganddo yn defnyddio adnodau a chyfeiriadau Beiblaidd sy'n dangos ei wir brofiad o'r Arglwydd. Fe aeth i'r Wladfa yn 1938 ac fe gafodd ei ddisgrifio gan un newyddiadurwr fel: "A distinguished Divine from Wales". Roedd yn fawr ei barch yn Rhydaman a phan bu farw ar Fehefin 18fed yn 1959 claddwyd ei weddillion o flaen drysau Bethany sydd bellach wedi cau. Cynhaliwyd y gwasanaeth datgorffori yno ar y 26ain o Hydref 2023.

William Nantlais Williams was the author of those verses which we learned as children. He was a Presbyterian Minister at Bethany Ammanford from 1900 until his retirement in 1944. Born in Gwyddgrug Pencader, he was a hymn writer, minister and a poet and won several bardic chairs including the Chair at the National Eisteddfod in 1902. However, following his conversion during the Revival of 1904 he gave up competing in order to devote his life to his Lord and to the Ministry. He wrote many hymns for children but his later ones are more theological in content. He was described in 1938 on his visit to Patagonia as "A distinguished Divine from Wales". He is buried in front of Bethany which unfortunately closed its doors for the last time in October of last year.

Babell Zion Newydd opened its doors to the Association on Wednesday May 1st with 25 present and about 12 on Zoom. Helen was the organist at the meetings and Carole at the Service of Communion at which Sian led the congregation in prayer and Helen read from the Gospel of Mathew Chapter 26 verses 17-30. Rev Eifion Roberts gave a short sermon on the following verse: "Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me."

The meetings were presided by Rev Richard Brunt London and the Secretary for this year is Mr Anthony Platt. Our Minister Emyr will succeed him in this role at the next Association to be hosted by the Morgannwg Llundain Presbytery at Eglwys y Drindod Cockfosters in London. The General Secretary for the denomination is the Rev Nan

Powell Davies who gave us a comprehensive insight into the work that has been done during the last year. One proposal which has been put forward is that of the commissioning of elders for a period of time only, say five or seven years. This has met with many different responses and is yet to be brought to a conclusion.

During the meetings we were encouraged by Mrs Margaret Jones to pray for the situation in Port Talbot where so many will be affected by the closure of the steel works there, and also for the situation in the Middle East.
