


Condolences/Cydymdeimlad

Please let family members and friends know about this event so we can raise as much money for this exceptional cause as we possibly can.




Rock of Ages

Whilst caravanning in Somerset this August we stayed in the little village of Bishop Norton. Evensong beckoned on the Sunday evening at St Andrew's Parish Church and in the absence of the organist I found myself seated at the organ. It was a very informal service for a very few of the faithful few together with the vicar and no specific hymns had been chosen. Having found Mission Praise I started to play Rock of Ages, cleft for me on the tune of Petra not knowing that the author of the words Rev Augustus Toplady –[1740-1778] had been an Anglican Minister in the nearby village of Blagdon in the 1700's. The



vicar went on to tell us that, according to tradition, Rev Toplady was travelling along the Gorge of Burrington Combe in the Mendip hills when he was caught in a storm. He found shelter in a gap in the gorge and drew his inspiration to write the hymn from that very incident.





We visited the Gorge and found the rock and the inscription [left]. One can only imagine what travelling was like in the 1700's and how dangerous it must have been to be out on such a stormy night. Rev Toplady was an Anglican cleric and a major Calvinist opposer of John Wesley. As it happened there were two chapels in Bishop Norton, now closed, with plaques commemorating the fact that John Wesley had preached there. Here is the hymn in full with the Welsh translation by Alafon [O.Gruffudd Owen].

Craig yr oesoedd, cuddia fi, Er fy mwyn yr holltwyd di; Boed i rin y dŵr a'r gwaed Gynt o'th ystlys friw a gaed Fy nglanhau o farwol rym Ac euogrwydd pechod llym.

Ni all gwaith fy nwylo i Lenwi hawl dy gyfraith di; Pe bai im sêl yn dân di-lyth A phe llifai 'nagrau byth, Iawn ni wnaent i gyd yn un: Ti all achub, ti dy hun.

Dof yn waglaw at dy groes, Glynaf wrthi drwy fy oes; Noeth, am wisg dof atat ti; Llesg, am ras dyrchafaf gri; Brwnt, i'r ffynnon dof â'm clwyf; Golch fi, Geidwad, marw 'rwyf.

Tra bwy'n tynnu f'anadl frau, Pan fo'r llygaid hyn yn cau, Pan fwy'n hedfan uwch y llawr, Ac yng ngŵydd dy orsedd fawr, Graig a holltwyd erof fi, Gad im lechu ynot ti. Rock of Ages, cleft for me, Let me hide myself in Thee; Let the water and the blood, From Thy riven side which flowed, Be of sin the double cure, Cleanse me from its guilt and power.

Not the labour of my hands Can fulfill Thy law's demands; Could my zeal no respite know, Could my tears forever flow, All for sin could not atone; Thou must save, and Thou alone.

Nothing in my hand I bring, Simply to Thy cross I cling; Naked, come to Thee for dress; Helpless, look to Thee for grace; Foul, I to the fountain fly; Wash me, Saviour, or I die!

While I draw this fleeting breath, When mine eyes shall close in death, When I soar to worlds unknown, See Thee on Thy judgement throne, Rock of Ages, cleft for me, Let me hide myself in Thee







Trip to Yr Ysgwrn and Byd Mari Jones

It was an early start for the long trip to Yr Ysgwrn near Trawsfynydd – a place I must admit neither Meurig nor myself had heard of and neither had we heard of Hedd Wyn. To break the journey, we had a brief stop in Machynlleth for a quick cuppa although some of the gentlemen did manage to gulp down a full cooked breakfast!!

On arrival at Yr Ysgwrn we were warmly welcomed with a cuppa and cakes whilst we were given a brief introduction to the history of the site followed by a short film. We were then taken up to the farmhouse, passing the little bungalow belonging to Gerald Williams – Hedd Wyn's nephew. We were told that sometimes he would appear in the window and wave at the visitors but sadly we did not get to see him that day. We were given a guided tour around the cottage and it was staggering to think that such a large family had been brought up in such a small space. We had the opportunity to see but not touch the famous "Black Chair" which had been posthumously awarded to Hedd Wyn during the 1917 National Eisteddfod. Next door to the farmhouse was the Tŷ Beudy which was showing a short film about the effects of the First World War. Being in the "beudy", sitting on bales of hay and watching the film on the whitewashed barn wall gave us a real sense of what life was like during those times. I take my hat off to the coach driver because the farm lane leading up to Yr Ysgwrn was so narrow, I would have had second thoughts travelling up to Yr Ysgwrn in a car let alone a coach.





Next we headed off to Byd Mary Jones in Llanycil near Bala and this time Meurig and I knew the story of Mary Jones and her long walk to purchase her very own Bible. After watching a short film, we wandered up to the church which had been refurbished as an education centre allowing visitors to discover the historic story of Mary Jones and to learn how she inspired the Bible Society movement. Just outside the church stood the grave of the Welsh Calvanistic Minister, Thomas Charles.

We finished off a very enjoyable day with a meal at Ffostrasol. Thank you Helen for organising and arranging everything involved with the trip.
