

Plaid first fought the Llangynnwr seat in 2004 & gained a credible third of the votes against an established Independent Councillor Merlin Jones. By 2008 the Independent majority had fallen by over 80% making the seat one of the most marginal in the county. Only 29 people would need to change their vote for Plaid Cymru to capture the seat.

Recent county by-elections & nearby Llanegwad Cenarth resulted in Plaid Cymru gains against independent candidates. The Plaid Cymru candidate is Williams Elwyn who is the Chairman of the Finance Community Committee of the Council. Elwyn was also recently elected as Chairman of governing body of Ysaol Llangynnwr. 

A view of the cottage by the entrance to Llangynnwr church painted over a century ago by BA Lewis. Many of his works are in Carmarthen museum and the National Museum of Wales in Cardiff. Lewis (1857 - 1946) or Lewis "Gas" was born in 1857 and died 89 years later on his birthday. He moved to London to set up the Wantage gas works in 1866 and worked in Cape Town for 4 years before returning in 1895 to Carmarthen to manage the Gas works in Morfa Lane.
