#### **Building delay**

Building work at the site of the old forge at Login has been put on hold. The conversion of the building residential use has been stopped by the county planning department. The site had planning permission to change land use to residential use but as construction work continued it became apparent that some of the existing walls were unsafe and two had to be demolished. At this point the planning department decided that a new planning application would have to be submitted leaving one remaining wall and a huge pile of soil and building rubble. Local councillors led by County Councillor Merlin Jones have expressed especially as the plans concern. incorporated features of the old smithy and the current mess gives poor impression

Llangynnwr as anyone enters the village.



## Welsh Coastal Footpath to run through parish

The Wales Coastal which is due to open in May 2012 will run through Llangynnwr. The 870 mile route will start outside Chester in the north and run the entire length of the Welsh coastline and end at Chepstow in the south. The path which was partly funded by a £3.9m EU grant will cross into Llangynnwr at Pont King Morgan, follow the new cycle route/ footpath around the railway station and down through Pensarn, passing under the bypass and out past Morrison's. The path will continue to the Pibwrlwvd roundabout and then cut down to the river and pass out of the parish by Ysgol Bro Myrddin.

Worries about lighting

Cllr Bevan who chaired the planning committee that passed the planning application confirmed that the conditions recommended by the community council included a condition that the size of the store sign should be no larger than the size of neighbouring PC World sign and lights should be on one hour before & after the store opened and closed.
